The watering was conducted during each of the following months _____
2219 - U.S. Forest - July 1st thru October 15th; 2420 - Private - January 1st thru December 31st.

"On the Diamond A Desert, between the Jarbidge and Bruneau Rivers, from the 1860's to 1889, Longhorn herds of southern Idaho's cattle barons (Dan Murphy, Byrne Brothers, and Barney Horne) ran in common with Pete Columbet's and John Dorsey's horse bands. Columbet and Dorsey were known as horse kings in this vicinity, from 1868 to 1889, and both had creeks named after them. After the severe winter of 1889-90, many of the large cattle and horse operations broke up and were replaced by smaller cattle outfits and flocks of sheep. Some of those were Ben Larios Ranch on Buck Creek; Fred Lancaster, located on Columbet Creek; Lou Eastman and Frank Winter on Dorsey Creek." (Nevada's Northeast Frontier - Page 649.)

Buck Creek Ranch is made up of two ranch units, the Larios Ranch and Brailsford Brothers. The U.S. Forest Paid Permit Record Cards indicate the following for the Larios Ranch:

In 1912, being the first record found, B.B. Larios had a paid permit of 50 cattle and 17 horses for the period of April 15 to October 31. In 1920, a permit to Pete Olabarria for 945 sheep with use from June 16 to October 15, was made. However, in 1928, an additional acquisition from Olabarria of a permit for 3,075 sheep, July 1 to October 15, was made. An additional permit of Fred L. Anderson was also transferred to Larios. The first permit record of Anderson in 1912 was for 725 cattle and 50 horses, year long, in the Diamond A Division. By 1947, Daniela Larios was licensed for 171 cattle July 1 to October 15 and 120 cattle July 1 to August 31. It appears that a greater number had been grazed. In the distribution of the Estate of Ben B. Larios to Daniela Larios, the Order being in 1926 and recorded in Book 13 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 605, Elko County, Nevada Records, the estate inventory was for 450 head of cattle, 32 horses and 50 sheep.

The same Forest Service records show the following for the Brailsford Brothers:

A portion of the permit was acquired from Fred Lancaster, who was an original permittee, for 35 cattle and 25 horses. They also acquired, in 1945, a permit issued to Curran & Elorriaga for 1,250 sheep, June 11 to October 15.

(10) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant in subsequent years was as follows: 1200 cow/calf = 2400 + 20 horses, total 2420 (See Remarks)

are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.
