(20) Remarks Stone Cabin 14ft. X 28ft. was built by John Kirkpatrick, who had mining property near by, in 1876. Water being available he built living quarters near his mine. Peggys Grandfather, Mitchell LeBeau acquired the mill site with stone house in mid eighties, holding the property for several years. Peggeys Grandmother, Della Archibald acquired the property in 1903 and held the property into early forties when she passed away. Peggy, her brother Earl LeBeau and their mother was the beneficiarys. Peggy and I worked and developed the property on our own. We put in a road to the camp and mine as there was only a pack trail up canyon until we put in the road, at a cost of \$65,000.00 in 1954. We became full owners in 1957.

John Kirkpatrick had a pipeline carrying water to his stone house as did Mitchell LeBeau who ~~was~~ acquired the property from Kirkpatrick. Mitchell LeBeau built a three room house, near stone cabin and ran pipeline to it for domestic use and a garden. I put in a small gold mill for testing ores in late fifties and as mill required more water I put in a new pipeline, enlarging pipe to one inch. Mill used six gallons of water a minute when operating.


