PROOF OF SUBSISTING RIGHT OF WATER FOR
STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

Pursuant to N.R.S. 533
As Amended by Chapter 473, 1993 Statutes, Sections 2, 3 and 4
Effective October 1, 1993

- (1) Name of Claimant Riordan Family Trust [Street and No. or P. O. Box No.] 400 Jiggs, Box 77 of [City or town] Elko, [State and Zip Code No.] Nevada 89801.
- (2) Source of water [Name of natural water source] North Fork of Lindsay Creek, tributary of Rocky Canyon and springs within their drainage area.
- (3) The water is diverted by [Dam, ditch, pipe line, natural channel, spring area, etc.] natural channel.
- (4) The water is diverted at the following point(s) [Describe as being within a 40-acre subdivision of public survey, and by course and distance to a section corner. If on unsurveyed land it should be stated. Diversion over a channel reach must be described by course and distance to a section corner for both the beginning and end of such reach.] The beginning of the reach is composed of two tributaries, the locations being described as follows:
- A. A point in the SW1/4SW1/4 of Section 5, T27N, R57E, MDB&M, from which the Southwest corner of Section 36, T28N, R56E, MDB&M, bears N 63°34'56" W a distance of 12,018.38 feet.
- B. A point in the NE1/4SW1/4 of Section 8, T27N, R57E, MDB&M, from which the southwest corner of Section 12, T27N, R56E, MDB&M, bears S 81°23'47" W a distance of 13,544.01 feet.
- From the two points of beginning of the reach described above, down the channels to a point in the NW1/4SE1/4 of Section 11, T27N, R56E, MDB&M, from which the Southeast corner of said Section bears S 45°37'31" E a distance of 2,377.99 feet.
- (5) The water is impounded in [Troughs, tanks, pools, reservoir, natural channel, etc.] natural channel and pools.
- (6) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun [Date] None and completed [Date] None.

(7) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the source of water and place of use are located is (Patented, deeded, public domain with grazing permit, etc.) upon National Forest administered lands upon which Claimant holds a grazing permit described as follows:

(8) The claimant's water right was not recorded in the office of the County Recorder of _____ County, at Page _____ of Book _____ of _____.

(9) The items of evidence for the numbers of livestock and date of priority are Affidavit of Walter I. Leberski (Exhibit "A" attached) and licenses issued by Forest Service for 1950 and BLM for 1948 (Exhibit "B" attached).

(10) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year [Date] 1885 and 1896 was unknown cattle, -0- horses -0- sheep or [Other] _____. The watering was conducted during each of the following months April 1 to November 1.

(11) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant in subsequent years was as follows: [If water was not used, or used in reduced quantity at any time, full information as to causes and duration of non-use should be given] 30 head of cattle with a priority of 1896 and 70 head of cattle with a priority of 1885 based upon numbers evidenced as grazing in the area as set forth in "Remarks" and Exhibits "A" and "B".

(12) The amount of water which has been necessary to be diverted for this purpose has been [448.83 gal. per min. equals 1 cubic foot per second] .00313 cubic feet per second.

(13) The works are located at [Describe as being within a 40-acre subdivision, section, township and range of public survey. If on unsurveyed land, it should be stated. None.

Remarks [Improvements, title, etc.] The first year of use is based in part upon the Application for Grazing Permit to the United States

Department of the Interior executed by Pearl Riordan for Dan Riordan estate dated April 11, 1935, in which it is stated that the lands covered with the grazing application have been used for the previous 66 years or in 1868. This is substantiated in the Decree of the Sixth Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Humboldt, entitled "In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights of the Humboldt River System and Tributaries," Proof 00365, which recognized the first irrigation use of water by predecessors in interest to the claimant to be in the year of 1870. Records reveal that predecessors in interest to the claimant purchase livestock and ranch property from Joseph H. Sanguinet in 1900 together with the brand JO which was first registered in 1885. As this is the first indication of numbers of livestock and in order to make a conservative claim, 1885 is claimed as a priority.

As to numbers of livestock that made use of the source, they are determined from various sources. Pearl Riordan, in the application for Grazing Permit submitted to the United States Department of Interior (a copy being attached to the Affidavit of Walter I. Leberski), States that 600 head of cattle were customarily ran. During that period of 1929 through 1934, there was an average of 185 cattle and 20 horses grazed upon the National Forest as reported in summary of operation prepared by O. H. Agee dated July 15, 1936 (a copy being attached to the Affidavit of Walter I. Leberski attached hereto). Therefore, it is assumed that the remainder, 415 cattle, grazed upon the public lands. However, Pearl Riordan States that in 1935 numbers had decreased and by 1948, the Bureau of Land Management permitted a maximum of 200 head of cattle upon the public lands.

In 1947, Joe J. Riordan and Pauline G. Riordan acquired a parcel of land commonly known as the Hankins property by conveyances recorded in Book 56 of Deeds at Pages 22 and 24, Elko County, Nevada, which Deed specifically conveyed a permit of 63 head of cattle upon the Forest. By 1950, this had been reduced to 50 head of cattle, as evidenced by a copy of the 1950 grazing permit upon the Forest which shows 50 cattle in Huntington Allotment (Corral Creek). The priority of this use is taken from

the operation summary of O. H. Agee referred to above as being 40 years previous to 1936 or 1896. This priority date is considered to be conservative.

Therefore, in summary, the total numbers of priority livestock watering upon the public lands and Forest reserve is as follows:

Administration of both the public lands and Forest Reserve since their inception has caused a major change in the waters used by these livestock. Prior to allotments, there were a number of sources of water used in common with other users. Through the allotment program of both the Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service there has, in effect, been changes in place of use made and trades among previously in common users. As a result, the sources of water and numbers of livestock using each source has been altered to the following:

This claim is for one of the sources described above.

The numbers of livestock above total greater than the total claimed upon the Forest Reserve. As cattle will move between waters within an allotment, the numbers on a source can vary through the season. The number claimed upon this source is the maximum that would occur during the grazing season.

The claimant is a successor in interest to Joseph H. Sanguinet, Daniel J. Riordan and Hankins Estate by the following chain of title:
