The range livestock use of this source originated from two ranch operations which existed in 1905. This was the Byrnes operation which had fenced property in Sections 24 and 25, Township 40 North, Range 52 East, and Sections 18 and 19, Township 40 North, Range 53 East, and the Schmidt property located in Sections 25, 35, and 36, Township 40 North, Range 52 East, and Sections 19, 30 and 31, Township 40 North, Range 53 East.

Historical accounts state that the Byrnes property was one of the early ranches in the area, but reliable written records of the numbers operated are not found for either operation.

Records of the Elko County Assessor reveal the following numbers as being assessed in 1896:

J. P. Byrnes	70 cattle
H. W. Schmidt	<u>66</u> cattle and horses
	136 livestock

Based upon this information, 136 head of livestock. Early patents issued show ownership of the presently owned lands in 1884, and even though historical records indicate a much earlier date of use, this is the first year of use claimed.

Due to the location of this source and the private property now owned, it is assumed that both operations used this source.

Both the Byrnes property and Schmidt property were combined into one operation under Van Norman Ranches, Inc. The claimant subsequently acquired primarily only the Schmidt property, but through purchases also acquired all of the land now associated with this source. Therefore, the claimant has all of priority for livestock.

Item 10

Approximate number of livestock water in subsequent years is also difficult. The 1905 Elko County Assessor records show J. P. Byrnes being assessed for 90 stock cattle. H. W. Schmidt sold to Harvey Sewell his entire operation in 1921. The bill of sale dated July 6, 1921, recorded in Book 2 of Bills of Sale at Page 121, Elko County, Nevada, inventory livestock sold as follows:

507 ewes
507 lambs
125 yearling ewes
42 cattle
60 horses.

This equates to 329 livestock when converting sheep on a basis of 5 to 1. Therefore, as high as 419 head of livestock used the various sources in subsequent years with the number shown in Item 10 being that estimated for this source.

Maps filed in the Office of State Water Engineer pursuant to the 1925 range livestock water legislation evidence that D. B. Williams (Map 144-30) claimed the area of this source as a customary area of use. He is in the chain of title of the property owned by the claimant.
