General Land Office (GLO) survey maps indicate that cattle were using the range and water surrounding Trout Creek Ranch by the year 1874 with depiction and labeling of the road and corral in Section 25 T39N/R31E. Various predecessors to the claimant, including James Sloan and George D. Bliss, have been grazing cattle in this area since 1889. In addition, various cattle ranchers, including Lay Brothers and Jackson Mountain Livestock Company constructed additional water sources for their cattle by digging underground wells prior to 1935. See recorded documentation and evidence presented in Exhibit "A" Proof of Vested Right; Exhibit "B" List of Nevada Patents; Exhibit "C" List of United States Patents; and Exhibit "D" Chain of Title (Exhibits "A" through "D"-on file with Division of Water Resources under Bliss Spring and Bliss Canyon V09804.





Attachment #1 to Amended Proof for Corbeal Well (V09847)

Part of the evidence for establishing use of the Corbeal Well is substantiated on the U. S. Surveyor General Office map for Township 38 North-Range 34 East, dated April 10, 1915 in Reno, Nevada. In the SW¼ NE¼ Section 24, the map designates a "well and horsepower pump". This location is not the same as described on this amended Proof. The "original" well is located, as above, or at a point from which the Northwest corner of Section 24 bears N 52° W, a distance of 4,070 feet. Apparently, a new well was drilled approximately 1,050 feet northwest of the "old" well at some time after 1915. The existence of the Corbeal Well in Section 24 Township 38 North-Range 34 East, on the U. S. Surveyor General Office map, clearly documents the existence of the well in 1915. This information, taken together with the information provided in the Remarks section of this Amended Proof, further substantiates the validity of this Proof.

(2) Source of water Corbeal Well (also known as Corbille Well)

(3) The water is diverted by a 10 inch diameter metal casing underground well pumped from the ground by a windmill tower with a 14 ft. diameter fan. A submersible pump is also installed and can be used to pump the water from the well. The water is then diverted into an 18 ft. diameter round galvanized steel trough with a cement bottom and finally into a 30 ft. diameter x 2 ft. deep overflow holding pond or reservoir.
Dam, ditch, pipe line, natural channel, spring area, etc.

(4) The water is diverted at the following point(s) T38N, R34E, Section 24: SE1/4 NW1/4
Describe as being within a 40-acre subdivision of public survey, and by course and distance to a section corner. If on unsurveyed land it should be stated.

(5) The water is impounded in an 18 ft. diameter round galvanized steel trough with a cement bottom and a 30 ft. diameter x 2 ft. deep overflow holding pond or reservoir.




