Remarks

Upper Canyon Spring was first developed and/or used in the 1870's to serve ranchers and miners in the area associated with livestock grazing animals belonging to the predecessors of the Claimant. Benton Springs just southeast were developed to serve a station along an important freight route beginning in the 1860's. It was known as the Columbus-Wadsworth freight route and was a toll-road shown on the 1884 USGS land survey plat as the Luning-Wadsworth road at Benton's house and tank. Predecessors of the claimant watered horses and cattle at Benton Springs beginning before 1880. Cattle use has been continuous since then. Predecessors sheep operators used these springs from about 1910 to 1923 and from 1938 to 1975. T.O. McKinnon ran angora goats (up to 9,000 head) in the vicinity from 1923 to 1945. Rawhide Ranch owns deeded land in the area at Indian Springs and Gillis Cabin/Sargent's Well. The Pilot-Table Mountain Grazing Allotment (See attached map) is a water based grazing allotment.

The undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by David G. and/or Jackie A. Holmgren are full and correct to the best of his/her knowledge and belief.




