County, State of Nevada, for the following reasons and on the following grounds, to wit:

1. Application is located in Railroad Valley. Drawdown of the water table in the southern portion of this valley will result in a loss of phreatophytic vegetation and increase desertification. Increased air pollution from alkali dust is detrimental to the public interest. This application, in conjunction with 17 others in Railroad Valley will have a cumulative impact of desertification on 326,050 acres.
2. Application is located within the Railroad Valley Water Basin which contains critical habitat for the Railroad Valley Springfish at North Spring, South Reynolds Spring, Hay Corral Spring, Big Spring, and Chimney Spring. This species has been federally listed as a threatened species as provided in the Endangered Species Act of 1973. Drawdown of the basin may reduce the flow from these springs and adversely affect critical habitat.
3. This application will prevent the flow of 4344 acre feet of ground water into the valley where the aquifer is intercepted by many zones of phreatic vegetation and various artesian springs. The cumulative impact of this application and 17 others within Railroad Valley will prove to be detrimental to the Railroad Valley Wildlife Management Area, an important wetlands area unique to central Nevada. Executive Order 11990, signed in 1977, directs federal agencies to take the necessary action to minimize the destruction, loss or degradation of wetlands. Water basin drawdown may reduce the water feeding this wetland area and so degrade the area in violation of EO 11990.
4. Application is located within the Nyala Allotment which has an existing licensed use of approximately 1200 cattle. The granting of this application may adversely affect ELM's ability to manage the livestock as specified in the Taylor Grazing Act, the Public Rangelands Improvement Act, and the Federal Land Policy and Management Act. These livestock depend upon water provided from the following source: Willow Spring. The granting of this application may adversely affect the flow from these sources which will reduce the amount of water available for livestock.

5. The Bureau is preparing notices of PWRs within the area of protest. These notices will be based only on the needs appropriate under PWR-107 and will be sent to the State Engineer over the next several months prior to adjudication.

6. Total amount of water applied for by the Las Vegas Valley Water District in the Railroad Valley (North) Basin is in excess of the 46,000 acre-feet per year of natural ground water recharge to the hydrographic area as presented in "Major Ground-Water Flow Systems in the Great Basin Region of Nevada, Utah and Adjacent States" (USGS, 1988)

7. Application is protested because the impacts of this application alone and in conjunction with the other applications filed by the Las Vegas Valley Water District are detrimental to the public interest by eliminating the capability to fulfill the legislated management responsibilities as outlined in the cover letter accompanying this protest.

8. At this time, there is insufficient information available to completely analyze and determine the full impacts to the various resources that the BLM is responsible to protect and manage. The actual impacts of the pumping of this well in conjunction with the cumulative impacts of the Las Vegas Valley Water Districts' other proposed wells cannot be fully determined until sufficient data has been collected and analyzed.

We, therefore, protest the granting of the water appropriation because neither the State Engineer nor the Las Vegas Valley Water District has prepared an analysis of all anticipated impacts associated with LVVWD's applications. If an analysis has been done, it has not been made available to the public and affected parties, and the failure to do so is not in the public interest as per NRS 533.370.3.

THEREFORE the protestant requests that the application be Denied  
denied, issued subject to prior rights, etc., as the case may be

and that an order be entered for such relief as the State Engineer deems just and proper.




Please find enclosed protests for twenty-two water rights applications (numbers 53965 to 53986) within the Battle Mountain District, Tonopah Resource Area. All of the applications were filed by the Las Vegas Valley Water District. The protests and this letter were filed with the Elko Field Office.

These applications are being protested as BLM personnel are directed to implement water rights policy 1) by "cooperating with the State Governments under the umbrella of State Law to protect water uses identified for public land management purposes" and 2) "to comply with the applicable state laws except as specifically mandated by congress". The purposes mandated by Congress are defined by the Federal Land Management Policy Act (FLPMA) include "multiple use" which is defined as "...the management of public lands and their various resource values so that they are utilized in the combination that will best meet the present and future needs of the American people." Uses associated with multiple use include but are not limited to "recreation, range, wildlife, minerals, watershed, and fish..." The Wild Horse and Burro Act, FLPMA and the National Environmental Policy Act also recognize free wild horses and burros as resource uses under BLM management responsibility. Any application to the State Engineer of Nevada for a water permit on BLM land that interferes with the capability of the agency to provide water for the afore stated uses within the legislated responsibilities of the agency will be protested.

In addition to FLPMA, the Taylor Grazing Act, the Recreation and Public Purposes Act, the Wild and Free Roaming Horse and Burro Act, the Endangered Species Act, the Public Rangelands Improvement Act, the Water Resources Act, and various other laws give the BLM the authority to manage the public lands and their various resources so that they are utilized in the combination that will best meet the present and future needs of the American people.

The application of the Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) to the State Engineer of Nevada to appropriate water on BLM administered land, if approved, will prove to be detrimental to the public interest by eliminating the capability to fulfill the legislated management responsibilities and is being protested under NRS 533.365.
