THEREFORE the protestant requests that the application be denied and that an order be entered for such relief as the State Engineer deems just and proper.



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SHEET "A"

1) The granting or approval of the referenced Application would conflict with or tend to impair prior rights applied for by this protestant in Application #48355, because if granted, it would exceed the safe yield of the subject basin, unreasonably lower the static water level and sanction water mining, especially in light of the cumulative impact of the referenced Application with the other Applications filed by the LVVWD in Railroad Valley.

2) The appropriation of this water when added to the already approved appropriations, existing uses and prior filed Applications of other parties for the Railroad Valley will exceed the annual recharge and safe yield of the basin. Appropriation and use of this magnitude, especially when considered cumulatively with the other LVVWD Applications in Railroad Valley, will degrade the quality of water available to other wells and uses and will cause negative hydraulic gradient influences as well as other negative impacts.

3) Inasmuch as a water extraction and transbasin conveyance project of this magnitude has never been considered by the State Engineer, it is impossible to anticipate all potential adverse impacts without further information and study. Accordingly, this protestant reserves the right to amend this protest to include such other issues as may develop as a result of further information and studies.

4) This protestant additionally incorporates by reference as though fully set forth herein and adopts as its own, each and every other protest to the subject application filed pursuant to NRS 533.365.
