
THEREFORE the protestant requests that the application be Denied

There has been only a minimal amount of effort by Clark County residents, the multitude of developers, or any of the numerous business/resort entities to conserve water in any of the ways found feasible, usable, and livable as has been implemented by so many other south western cities. There has not been an Environmental Impact Statement prepared or, to my knowledge, ordered. Has it been taken into consideration that Southern California is losing its Colorado River water rights by the end of this decade? Who is this water really being grabbed for? Any water rights acquisitions of this magnitude without proper prior investigations should be seen as obviously suspect. What's the rush?
