



The above referenced applications propose to appropriate groundwater rights in the Cold Springs Hydrographic Basin.

State Engineer Rulings #4560 and #4567 issued on August and September of 1997, respectively have denied new appropriations of groundwater in Cold Springs.

In his rulings, the State Engineer concluded that:

- 1) There is no un-appropriated water in the source,
- 2) Granting of the applications would conflict with existing rights,
- 3) and could pose detrimental to public interest
