

### ATTACHMENT FOR PROTESTS OF APPLICATIONS 73678 (Jakes Valley)

This application is being protested by the Bureau of Land Management because it would exceed the estimated perennial yield for Jakes Valley (Basin 174). According to the State of Nevada's Water Resources and Inter-Basin Flows Map, the estimated perennial yield for Jakes Valley (Basin 174) is 12,000 acre feet. Existing water rights total approximately 1,800 acre feet leaving 10,200 acre feet. This application, along with the other six applications filed by Nevada Power Company in Jakes Valley (Basin 174), would use 15,200 acre feet exceeding what is available by 5,000 acre feet.

Granting water rights for these applications are not in the public interest because the loss of groundwater would affect habitat for wildlife and wild horses. Deer Spring, Indian Spring, and Willow Spring are located near the applications and could be affected by the drawdown from these applications.
