



## EXHIBIT A

1. The U.S. Department of Energy Filings will cause drawdown of water sources in the area.
2. Drawdown will reduce the flows of present sources.
3. Allowing these filings will increase our pumping costs for wells within the area as we will need to pump water from deeper depths.
4. If the U.S. Department of Energy permits are granted, the water table will be lowered and we may have to deepen our present wells in the area.
5. The U.S. Department of Energy filings would cause interference with our grazing operation as we control the movement of livestock through control of water. We would have no control over the U.S. Department of Energy's water and thus our livestock management plan may be disrupted.
6. Springs within the area may be dried up if the U.S. Department of Energy is permitted to remove water from the ground basin.
7. The protestant is informed and believes that it has vested rights to use the water for stockwater purposes to the extent that to grant the U.S. Department of Energy applications would impair the vested rights of the protestant.
8. The applications are detrimental to the public welfare. The water on all source in Nevada belongs to the public. (NRS 533.025) Granting of the applications will surrender this public ownership and the sovereign rights of the State of Nevada in and to the water, to the U.S. Department of Energy contrary to the best interests and general welfare of the State of Nevada.
9. The U.S. Department of Energy applications are for the construction and maintenance of the proposed Yucca Mountain Railroad. If constructed the railroad would directly infringe on over 15 of the Twin Springs Ranch's existing water rights as well as their grazing operation as a whole. Allowing these applications would allow the railroad to exist thus causing reparable and irreparable damage to the protestants business *operation and water rights*.
10. The U.S. Department of Energy Chief, Steven Chu, is quoted in the Tonopah Times Bonanza, as saying "That's True [Yucca Mountain is No Longer an Option]", in which case the water applications should be immediately withdrawn before the State of Nevada is burdened with the cost and time of further processing the applications.
11. Allowing the U.S. Department of Energy's filings would allow the existence of the proposed Yucca Mountain Railroad. This would open the possibility of nuclear

contamination of surface and ground water in the event of a nuclear leak, either accidental or terrorist caused. This health risk certainly is not in the best interest of the protestant or the State of Nevada.

12. The protestant stands in agreement with protests filed by the Nevada Agency for Nuclear Projects, against the U.S. Department of Energy's water applications.
