

EXHIBIT "A"

1. This application is for diversion from an underground water source. The proposed point of diversion is in close proximity to an existing water delivery line owned and operated by Goldfield Utilities from which water is available. The application is therefore unnecessary and the granting thereof would be against the public interest.
2. Upon information and belief, the granting of the subject application will conflict with and adversely impact existing rights, including but not limited to those within the "Klondike Well Field" which Goldfield Utility uses and relies upon for water service in Esmeralda County.
3. This application is one of many applications filed by the U.S. Department of Energy for approximately 6,000 acre feet of water in Lincoln, Nye and Esmeralda Counties. Because the applications are supplemental to one another, and the proposed places of use overlap between basins and between counties, the applications, taken together, are ambiguous and not subject to scientific analysis as to their potential impacts within individual basins. Upon information and belief, such diversion and export between basins and counties will unreasonably lower the static water level in the basins of diversion, adversely affecting the quality of remaining groundwater and threatening the continued existence of springs, seeps and phreatophytes which provide water and habitat critical to the survival of wildlife, grazing livestock and other surface area existing uses.
4. Upon information and belief, there is no unappropriated water available at the proposed source.
5. Upon information and belief, the granting of the subject application, when considered together with the other applications filed by the applicant, will deprive Esmeralda County, and its current and future residents, of water resources needed for its environmental and economic well being and for the opportunity for future population growth.
6. Upon information and belief, the subject application should be denied because individually and cumulatively with other applications related to the proposed project, it will exceed the safe yield of the source.
7. The granting of a permit for appropriation of waters as proposed in the subject application without a condition that ownership of the proposed works be transferred to Esmeralda County for monitoring purposes and/or potential future utilization upon discontinuance of the purposes for which the appropriation is sought, as described in the application, would be detrimental to the public interest.
