Re; In response to Water filings No. 83129

I would like answers to the following concerns.

1. Does the BLM intend to place 589 wild horses at the Sabala Springs?
2. Does NDOW intend to plant 3896 deer, 146 elk, and 400 pronghorn to this spring ?

As a permittee with 55 years experience operating the Moorman Ranch, I would judge that within a radius of five miles, this spring would only provide enough water for ten horses, ten elk, and twenty antelope. This number of animals do have access to the water at this time.

To give ownership of this water, to a single entity, goes against the multiple use principle of good land management.

There is no need for the government to grab this valuable resource, in an effort to dominate the resource.

Therefore, no change of permitted water is needed.
