R U L I N G

GENERAL

An application for a well driller's license was received on October 22, 1971, with the statutory \$25.00 fee from William Roger Kuebler. Receipt No. 3415 was issued on October 22, 1971, to the applicant.

Requests for references were forwarded to persons listed on the application on October 26, 1971. References were received from four of the five persons listed on the application.

A letter was sent to Mr. Kuebler on October 26, 1971, requesting evidence of an application to or a contractor's license from the State Contractors Board or the name of the licensed contractor, if he was to be employed. Mr. Kuebler responded by a letter dated November 2, 1971, that he did not intend to apply for a contractor's license and that he was employed by W. L. McDonald and Company.

The applicant was notified by certified mail on November 30, 1971, that the Statewide Well Drillers' Advisory Board would consider his application at the December 17, 1971, meeting and requested Mr. Kuebler to appear for an oral interview. The notice was returned to this office unclaimed, with "Moved-Left no address" stamped by the Post Office Department. Mr. Kuebler failed to appear before the Board at the scheduled meeting or contact this office to request an interview at another time. Board member McDonald stated that Mr. Kuebler was employed by him but that he had been terminated.

The Statewide Well Drillers' Advisory Board at the December 17, 1971 meeting recommended denial of the application by William Roger Kuebler.

RULING

The application for a well driller's license filed by William Roger Kuebler is herewith denied on the grounds that he failed to appear for an oral interview before the Statewide Well Drillers' Advisory Board, and, thus, it cannot be determined that he has sufficient experience to qualify as a well driller.
