GENERAL:

87 Application 22974 was filed on February 22, 1966, by the Grand View Manor Water System, Inc., for permission to appropriate 1.0 cfs of water from an underground source for quasi-municipal (subdivision) and domestic purposes. The point of diversion is described as within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 34, T. 18N., R. 20E., MDB&M. The place of use is described within portions of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 34, T. 18N., R. 20E., MDB&M.

Report No. 264 of field investigation dated September 26, 1966, indicates that the well under Application 22974 and the well under Permit 13492, Certificate 4102, in the name of Anna D. Schindler are one and the same well. A representative of the applicant was advised at the time of the field investigation that before a permit could be issued under Application 22974 that certified copies of deeds or other instruments of transfer would be required to be submitted to this office to complete the chain of title from Anna D. Schindler to the Grand View Manor Water System, Inc.


A total of five (5) documents were submitted by Mr. Paul Hall for the Grand View Manor Water System, Inc., but did not complete the chain of title from Anna D. Schindler. A total of twenty one (21) documents were submitted by Mr. Mack Fry, attorney at law, but these documents also did not complete the chain of title to his client, Don and Ora May Rogan.

All documents were returned to both claimants, Mr. Paul Hall and Mr. Mack Fry, on February 12, 1968, by certified mail and with the provision that certified copies of deeds or other instruments of transfer must be submitted to this office within thirty (30) days to complete the chain of title to the present owner or the application would be in poor standing and subject to cancellation. The applicant under Application 22974 was also advised by a letter of February 12, 1968, that any operational agreement between the owners of record of said application and permit 13492 would also be considered. No interest was expressed by either claimant during this thirty (30) day period regarding the necessary documents.

RULING:

Application 22974 is herewith denied on the grounds that the granting of this application would conflict with an existing water right.
