Dear Mr. McNinch :

Steffen Robertson and Kirsten (U.S.), Inc. (SRK) is hereby notifying the Washoe County District Health Department (WCDHD) of the discontinuation of ground water quality monitoring and the abandonment of the ground water quality monitoring wells at the R-Bar Cocktail Lounge, 3155 Kietzke Lane, in Reno, Nevada. These actions were performed in response to your correspondence of August 10, 1993 to Ms. Carolyn Hird, which directed the closure of the monitoring wells within 60 days of the receipt of the letter. The WCDHD's correspondence directed the closure and abandonment of the monitoring wells in response to the results of the Report of Fourth Quarterly Monitoring, submitted by SRK to the WCDHD on July 15, 1993.

The well abandonment activities were performed on September 29, 1993, by West Hazmat Drilling Corp. of Sacramento, California. Abandonment activities were observed by a qualified SRK environmental specialist. Abandonment consisted of removal, by drilling, of the well casing cement and sanitary seals, and the filter pack. The well annulus was subsequently filled with neat cement from total drilled depth to ground surface. The removed filter pack and seal materials were stockpiled on-site and covered with plastic. The material will be properly disposed of, pending the results of laboratory analysis of the samples taken from the stockpiled sand.
