


Dear Tom:

The School District's well, referred above, was plugged using the following procedure:

Seventy two feet of steel galvanized pipe, with a cutter blade, was worked through debris encountered at 44 feet and followed with 258 feet of 1 1/4 poly pipe to within 10 feet of the well's original depth. At this depth bentonite was pumped into, and circulated throughout, the well. The poly pipe was then pulled and dynamite charges were taped into the pipe then reinstalled to shoot the casing at 50 feet and 120 to 165 feet. The balance of the poly again was pulled, cleaned up, added to, and tripped in to 330 feet. The well was then pumped full of neat cement.

The debris noted above came out in the form of pop cans, pvc pipe, 2X4 lumber, lineshaft lube oil, and one tennis ball. However no discernable remains of past unruly students or gold doubloons were noted.
