

STATE OF NEVADA**CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER**

Under the provisions of NRS 533.425, the State Engineer has determined:

The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

Highland Ditch

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 9, T.19N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 9, bears S. 75°16' E., a distance of 1,650.0 feet situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Owner of record: **Washoe County, City of Reno and City of Sparks (each as to a 1/3 undivided interest)**

Source: **Truckee River**

Manner of use: **Wildlife**

Amount of appropriation: **0.004 c.f.s., but not to exceed 0.43 acre-feet as decreed**

Period of use: **As Decreed**

Date of priority: **April 2, 1875***

Description of the works of diversion and the manner and place of use:

Water flows in the natural channel of the Truckee River for wildlife purposes from Highland Ditch downstream to the inlet of Pyramid Lake, Washoe and Storey Counties, Nevada.


This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and specifically subject to the following terms:

This certificate is issued subject to the continuing jurisdiction and regulation by the Federal Water Master and the State Engineer.

***This certificate changes the point of diversion, place and manner of use of Permit 67978, which changed the point of diversion, place and manner of use of a portion of Claim 133, Truckee River Final Decree, United States v. Orr Water Ditch Co., In Equity Docket No. A-3 (D. Nevada 1944); therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Claim 133.**

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
