

THE STATE OF NEVADA
CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Wm. A. Bartholomae, Jr. has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Number Four Spring through dams and ditches for Stockwatering purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 3, T. 15 N., R. 51 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the E 1/4 corner of said Sec. 3 bears S. 8° 55' E., 393.26 feet. situated in Eureka County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 0.006 c.f.s. or sufficient to water 200 cattle
Period of use, from July 1 to December 1 of each year
* Date of priority of appropriation August 25, 1916

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is impounded by means of seven earthen dams 4 to 7 feet long and 1 to 2 feet high constructed across the channel creating small stock-watering ponds. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

*NOTE: Permit No. 13488 was issued to change the manner of use under Permit No. 4127 and the date of priority of this certificate, therefore, remains the same as that under Permit No. 4127.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
