CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Sterling C. Ditsworth, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through well, pump, and irrigation system for irrigation purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 3, T. 21 S., R. 54 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 3 bears S. 2° 54' 00" W., a distance of 1318.0 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Post-office address Pahrapump, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 3.0 cfs but not to exceed 2119.0 ac. ft. annually.
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
* Date of priority of appropriation November 26, 1940

*This certificate changes the place of use of Permit No. 10600, hence the priority of appropriation of this certificate is the same as Permit No. 10600.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 5.2 ac. ft. per acre annually from all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
