Gentlemen:--

You, and each of you, are hereby notified that all maps, plats, surveys, and evidence now on file in the office of the State Engineer, relating to the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights in and to the waters of Barber Creek (Jobs Canyon Creek), will be considered by the State Engineer in the preparation of his order of determination of the relative rights on such stream system.

Sixty days from date are allowed in which to file any additional or supplementary maps, plats, surveys, or evidence, or objections to the admissibility of any evidence hitherto presented and on file in this office in relation to your claim of water right or adverse to the claim of any other party or parties in interest, as provided by Section 14 of an Act approved March 25, 1915, being an Act amending Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913, to which Acts reference is hereby specifically made.

No extension of time is provided by law.
