

waters of Koebeh Valley situated in Eureka



The Koebeh Valley Basin is presently fully appropriated at 18,000 acre feet. Granting these applications would put the use of water in the Koebeh Valley Basin at approximately 200% of perennial yield. Mr. Risi's concerns include the loss of ground water, runoff, drying up of springs, ability to irrigate, domestic water loss, and increased costs for pumping water for domestic use, livestock use, and irrigation.

Additional concerns are the de-valuing of both deeded acres and BLM grazing permits owned by Roy Risi in Koebeh Valley, Eureka County.
