PURPOSES IN PERSHING COUNTY, NEVADA.))

GENERAL:

Application 6318 was filed November 5, 1920, by Don L. Cooper to appropriate 1200 acre feet of the water of Pleasant Valley Creek for irrigation and stock watering purposes. The point of diversion is described as being in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 2, T. 28N., R. 38E., MDB&M.

The application was protested December 4, 1920, by Sylvain Siard and Blanche Siard on the grounds that the protestants have a prior vested right to these waters and also prior applications filed for waters from Pleasant Valley Creek.

A field investigation was made by John V. Mueller and on June 8, 1922, he recommended that this application be granted subject to existing rights.

No subsequent action was taken on Application 6318 until December 27, 1967, when the applicant was given 30 days in which to express a desire that the application be processed.

Service could not be secured on the applicant at the address of record in this office.

RULING

Application 6318 is denied on the grounds that the applicant failed to submit information as requested, and action without such information would be detrimental to the public welfare.
