R U L I N G

GENERAL:

Application 8392 was filed by John G. Pace on November 17, 1927, for permission to appropriate 1.0 c.f.s. of water from Rye Patch Reservoir for stock watering and domestic purposes. The point of diversion was described as being within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 30, T.2N., R.63E., M.D.B.&M. The proposed place of use is described as within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.


This application was protested by Adams McGill Company on March 7, 1928, on the grounds that the applicant does not have grazing rights in this area and the permit issued under this application would interfere with the protestants range rights and stockwatering.

A letter was sent to the applicant on February 20, 1970, by certified mail inquiring as to continued interest in this application and requesting evidence that he owned the range rights in the area and could beneficially use the water covered by this application. Said letter was returned by the Post Office Department stamped: "Unclaimed."

RULING

Application 8392 is herewith denied on the grounds that the applicant failed to submit the required information necessary before a permit could be issued under this application.
