R U L I N G

GENERAL:

Applications 29998 and 29999 were filed on February 13, 1976 by R. E. Stromberg, each to appropriate 0.6 c.f.s. of water from an underground source for quasi-municipal purposes. Water is to be diverted from its source by two wells located within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 23, T.17N., R.19E., MDM. The place of use under both applications is described within portions of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 23, T.17N., R.19E., MDM. The period of use is to be from January 1 to December 31 of each year. The applicant states that the proposed water system is to serve 5 houses @ 2,000 gpd, 1 service station @ 1,500 gpd, 1 restaurant @ 4,000 gpd, 3 commercial units @ 200 gpd per unit and 6 apartments @ 250 gpd per apartment to total 17,600 gallons perday.

By undated letter received in the office of the State Engineer on May 17, 1976, the applicant requested the 3 commercial units @ 200 gpd per unit and the 6 apartments @ 250 gpd per apartment be removed from Item 12 of Applications 29998 and 29999.

Protests to the granting of Application 29998 were filed by the following: Sid MacDonald on May 7, 1976; Stan Ronsley on May 10, 1976; Harry N. Peck on May 11, 1976; Eula M. Overton on May 20, 1976 and by Clyde W. Folz on May 20, 1976. The protest of Stan Ronsley was withdrawn by letter dated May 18, 1976. The protest by Harry N. Peck was withdrawn by letter dated May 20, 1976. The protests requested that Application 29998 be denied on the grounds that the additional development would adverse each protestants' domestic well.

Protests to the granting of Application 29999 were filed by the following: Richard G. Knight on May 5, 1976; Mary H. Miller on May 14, 1976; J. L. Jackson on May 19, 1976; and Alan J. Carlson on May 24, 1976. The protests requested that Application 29999 be denied on the grounds that the additional development would adverse each protestants' domestic well.

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
The Division of Water Resources has compiled a table of water use for many types of services from information available to this office. Using this table, the water service to the proposed development would be limited to 1,000 gallons per day per single family residence, 1,500 gallons per day for a service station and 1,000 gallons per day for a restaurant. Based on these figures, the combined total quantity of water diverted would be limited to 7,500 gallons per day under Applications 29998 and 29999.

RULING:

The protests to Applications 29998 and 29999 are herewith overruled on the grounds that the granting of Applications 29998 and 29999 will not adversely affect the value of existing rights or be otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. Permits will be granted upon payment of the statutory fees and limited to a combined total diversion of 7,500 gallons per day.
