

IN THE MATTER OF APPLICATION NO.
14509 FILED AUGUST 29, 1952 BY
HOWARD O. KNOUS TO APPROPRIATE
THE WATERS OF RIDGER CREEK IN
WHITE PINE COUNTY, WHICH WAS
PROTESTED ON DECEMBER 18, 1952
AND DECEMBER 31, 1952 BY THE
SWALLOW BROTHERS.

RULING

General:

Application No. 14509 was filed on August 29, 1952 by Howard O. Knous for 4.0 c.f.s. of the waters of Ridger Creek for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion was described as being in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 17, T. 13 N., R. 68 E., M.D.B.&M. The place of use for 160 acres of land within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 34, T. 13 N., R. 67 E., M.D.B.&M.

The applicant applied to the Bureau of Land Management under D.L.E. No. 011395 to acquire the lands to be irrigated under this application. On October 10, 1957, we were advised by the Bureau of Land Management that D.L.E. No. 011395 was closed and cancelled on their records.

RULING

Application No. 14509 is herewith denied on the grounds that the applicant does not have land on which to place the water to beneficial use, and therefore, could not comply with the provisions of any permit we might issue to him.
