On the 19 of June, 1989, a well was drilled on Nellis AFB NV. It was drilled within SE 1/4, NW 1/4, Section 9, T.20S., R.62E., with permit #W2018. The depth of the well was 1020 ft, and the condition of the well casing was in good condition. On 25 June, we decided to plug the well, the casing could not be pulled out of the ground or be ripped, so we plugged with neat cement up to ground level. This was the only method available to us at the time and also I did not want the well to be left open any longer than it had to be. Thank you.
